All entrants to the Fairest Little Miss, Fairest Junior Miss, Fair Princess and Fairest of the Fair must be actual residents and domiciled in White County, Tennessee. Actual resident is defined as an individual living on property assessed to White County by the White County Tax Assessor's Office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, applicants temporarily attending college or vocational school with the intent to return to their home in White County are considered residents of the county for purposes of this contest. In cases of joint custody in which only one parent/guardian is a White County resident, contestant must live and attend a White County School in order to qualify for pageant.

The deadline for entering this pageant is August 27, 2011.

Submit applications along with a \$10.00 entry fee in person at the White County Agricultural Complex (at Fairgrounds) in Sparta on August 20th or August 27TH 8:30a.m. -12:00 noon. Make checks payable to: White County Fair Association.

This contest will be an annual event of the White County Fair for the purpose of providing young and pre-teenage girls the opportunity to compete in a beauty pageant and encourage

contestants to later participate in the Junior Miss, Fair Princess, and Fairest of the Fair Pageants.

The contest will provide additional attractions for the opening night pageantry festivities.

1. Each contestant must have reached her 7th birthday but not her 10th birthday by August 31, 2011.
2. Dresses may be any length. Contestants will not be permitted to wear corsages or carry flowers during the pageant. No visible body piercing other than ears and no visible tattoos.
3. Each contestant must be an actual resident of White County.
4. The White County Fair Association will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles, damages to apparel or accessories, or bodily injury incurred by a contestant during the pageant or pageant activities.
5. **Winner is required to be present for other Fair**

Events throughout the week, when requested.

Submit applications along with a \$10.00 entry fee in person at the White County Agricultural Complex (at Fairgrounds) Sparta on August 20th or August 27th - 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Make checks payable to: White County Fair Association.

This Contest is an annual event of the White County Fair for the purpose of providing pre-teenage girls the opportunity to compete in a beauty pageant, and encourage contestants to later participate in the Fair Princess and the Fairest of the Fair pageants.

The deadline for entering this pageant is August 27, 2010.

Submit applications along with a \$10.00 entry fee in person at the White County Agricultural Complex (at Fairgrounds) in Sparta on August 20th or August 27th. :30 a.m. – 12:00 noon. Make checks payable to: White County Fair Association.

This contest is one of the annual events of the White County Fair for the purpose of providing early teenage girls the opportunity to compete in a beauty pageant. Secondly, to encourage contestants to participate in the “Fairest of the Fair” pageant and finally to provide additional attractions for the opening night activities.

1. Each contestant must have reached her 13th birthday, but not her 16th birthday on August 31, 2011.
2. Dresses may be any length. Contestants will not be permitted to wear corsages or carry flowers during the pageant. No visible body piercing other than ears and no visible tattoos.
3. Each contestant must be an actual resident of White County.

4. The White County Fair Association will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles, damages to apparel or accessories, or bodily injury incurred by a contestant during the pageant or pageant activities.
5. **Winner is required to be present for other Fair Events throughout the week, when requested.**

FAIREST OF THE FAIR

The deadline for entering this pageant is August 27, 2011.

Submit applications along with a \$ 10.00 entry fee in person at the White County Agricultural Complex (at Fairgrounds) in Sparta, on August 20th or August 27th – 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 noon. Make check payable to: White County Fair Association.

All contestants must be permanent residents of White County. This contest is co-sponsored by the White County Fair Association and the Tennessee Associations of Fairs. A state-wide contest will be held in Nashville in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Association in January, 2012.

The purpose of this pageant is two-fold. **First**, previous experience indicates that a beauty contest is a highly successful feature for most fairs. Publicity provides an excellent tie-in with the state-wide contest to give local interest to the fair feature. The contest, both local and in state participation, gives fairs splendid publicity both at home and in the metropolitan press (radio and television.) **Second**, the enthusiasm for the state-wide contest provides a real incentive for the annual meeting.

1. Each contestant must have reached her 16th birthday but not her 21st birthday on or before December 31, 2011.
2. A contestant cannot qualify if she has ever been married, had a child, or been found guilty of a felony.
3. The contestant must be currently and always has been of the female gender.
4. Dresses must be formal and must be floor-length. No exposed midriff. No visible body piercing other than ears and no visible tattoos. Contestants will not be permitted to wear corsages or carry flowers during the judging of the contest.
5. Contestants will be judged: on beauty; poise and personality.
6. Each contestant must be an actual resident of White County.
7. The White County Fair Association will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles, damages to apparel or accessories, or bodily injury incurred by a contestant during the pageant or pageant activities.

Fairest of the Fair Pageant Scholarship

The ***Fairest of the Fair*** Pageant Winner will be eligible for a college or university scholarship within the State of Tennessee.

The following criteria will be followed in awarding the scholarship each year:

1. The amount of the scholarship will be \$1,000.
2. One-half of the amount (\$500.) will be issued upon completion of the first semester. The second half will be issued upon completion of the second semester's work. The recipient must produce documents of being enrolled and having a 3.0 or higher GPA. Needs to be acquired first semester upon entrance.

- 3 In the event the winner is not ready to enter college, having not yet finished high school at that time, the money will be left in the bank account and when she is ready to enter college, it will be issued in the above manner without accrued interest. Upon completion of High School, winner must enter college during the following Fall Semester.
4. If the winner of the *Fairest of the Fair* pageant does not plan to enter college, then the scholarship will be forfeited.
