As volunteers, we make every effort to show respect to all who attend the fair. It has become necessary that we add this statement to all printed materials. Any person, participants, exhibitor, guest or other individual being disrespectful to any volunteer or guest prior to or during the fair will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and/or denied admission to the fair."

WHITE COUNTY AGRICULTURE FAIR RULES & REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITS AND EVENTS

- 1.Competition is open to the people as stated in each event.
- 2.Every animal and article entered for exhibition shall be under the control of the Superintendent, and while every precaution will be taken to prevent damage or loss, the Superintendents will not be responsible in any case for damage, accident or loss that may occur.
- 3.The White County Fair Association will not be responsible for any personal injury or property damage of any kind whatsoever received on the Fair Ground on in connection with the Fair..
- 4.The Superintendent of each department shall have supervision and control of all exhibits during the duration of the Fair.
- 5.No names, marks or other identification of ownership will be allowed on anything except canned goods, until after the premiums are awarded.
- 6.All premiums will be awarded as follows: First - Blue Ribbon, Second - Red Ribbon, Third - White Ribbon
- 7.With the exception of Livestock and Poultry, only one entry will be allowed in any lot from the individual or family.
- 8.Where all entries in any class belong to the same individual, in Livestock and Poultry, only (2) two monies will be paid, although he may enter as many animals as he desires.
- 9.No person will be allowed to exhibit products in any other person's name.
- 10.Premiums will be allowed only on articles named in the catalog.
- 11.No article or animal deemed unworthy will be awarded premiums.
- 12.Superintendent of Stalls is in charge of housing of all livestock.
- 13.The Fair Management reserves the right to cancel, any or all classes because of excessive weather, fire or any other calamity over which we have no control.
- 14.All Poultry are to stay on the Fairgrounds until 1:00 p.m., Sunday, otherwise prizes will be voided.
- 15.Each Superintendent is responsible for acquiring someone to take entries in his/her department and being sure that the entry books or lists are turned into the office immediately following their show. These records are required by our auditors and it is important we comply with this requirement.
- 16.If you need supplies for your department please let us know now so we can have them available for you to get your show started on time.
- 17.An admission will be charged.
- 18.All exhibits are to remain through 1:00 p.m., Sunday.

STATE AID FOR FAIRS

JUNIOR POULTRY

Rules:

1. White County Residents only. To show in the White County Poultry competition, owners and exhibitors must be a resident of White County 60 days prior to the show or be a land owner of White County. The bird(s) must be owned 30 days prior to the competition. Proof of ownership and residency is required.
2. All birds must be entered SATURDAY, September 2, 2023 8A.M. - NOON and remain on exhibit until Sunday, Sept 10th. Judging will be at 5:00P.M. SATURDAY, Sept. 3.
3. Singles: One hen,(cockerel or pullet will not be allowed to be shown in pens)
4. Pens: One cockerel and two pullets or 3 Pullets.
5. Hens will be judged on the basis of egg production and show characteristics.
6. No make up classes will be allowed.
7. *Note: Cockerels are males UNDER one year of age.* Water and containers are responsibility of exhibitor.
8. All entries must be picked up by 1-3 pm Sunday, Sept. 10th.
